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Heritage Wanhua Eatery Serving Popular Foods — Yi Jia Zi's Zushi Temple Stewed Pork with Rice, Gua Bao

Located in Wanhua District along the street-corner arcade where Kangding Rd. and Changsha St. meet, Yi Jia Zi was originally a takeaway joint where people would queue, highly popular both with locals and foodies from further afield. Its signature offerings are Madou rice cake, gua bao (pork with other goodies in a steamed bun), soy-stewed pork belly with rice, soy-braised minced pork with rice, and pig blood and pig intestine soup. All are wonderfully tasty and inexpensive choices, but the ity has skyrocketed since its prestigious Bib Gourmand recommendation in the 2020 edition, so make sure to line up early to avoid disappointment!

Taipei Tonghua Night Market — Yu Pin Yuan Iced and Hot Tangyuan

Yu Pin Yuan Iced and Hot Tangyuan, located in the Tonghua Night Market, has been a Michelin Bib Gourmand recommendation two consecutive years, the first in 2019. The perfectly round, chewy tangyuan (sweet dumplings), all made by hand, come in two flavors, sesame or peanut. The piping-hot, freshly cooked dumplings can be paired with shaved ice or with fermented rice soup, both options much praised. When visiting Taipei, this opportunity must not be missed!

Maokong is one of north Taiwan's key tea production areas, renowned for its Tieguanyin (Iron Goddess) and Wenshan Baozhong teas. The mountainous district is also interlaces with nature trails, presenting scenery that thrills visitors! The city government's Department of Information and Tourism has launched five special Maokong feature tours, entitled "Instagram Beauty Shot Tour," "Maokong Forest Friends Club," "My Leisurely Roaming Travels," "Taipei Grand Trail," and "So Much Like Love." In addition to its well-known Maokong Gondola service, night views, tea culture, and great food, Maokong highlights include the Camphor Tree Trail, Maokong Soil and Water Conservation Education Park, Maokong potholes, and other scenic attractions an "secret" spots. The area is conveniently reached via public transportation, making a leisurely mountain-forest walk and escape from the city's hubbub the simplest of things!

Taipei City Rainbow Landscape

On May 17, 2019, Taiwan became the first country in Asia to legalize same-sex marriage. On September 25 of the same year, the dedicated efforts of a number of organizations in Taipei City, the Rainbow Six landscape was created at Exit 6 of MRT Ximen Station. In October the city's second rainbow landscape was born, the Rainbow Starting Line, on the Civic Plaza in front of Taipei City Hall. Extending from Taipei City Hall toward the Taipei City Council building, it resembles the lanes on an athletic track, giving it the look of a starting line in a run toward happiness and also echoing the Taiwan LGBT Pride parade launched in front of Taipei City Hall each year.

Because of its role over many years as the starting point for the LGBT Pride parade, the plaza, creating a rainbow landscape here is of special significance, symbolizing Taipei City's respect for human rights and its energetic promotion of gender equality and gender friendliness. Their special meaning has made these rainbow landscapes popular check-in attractions.
